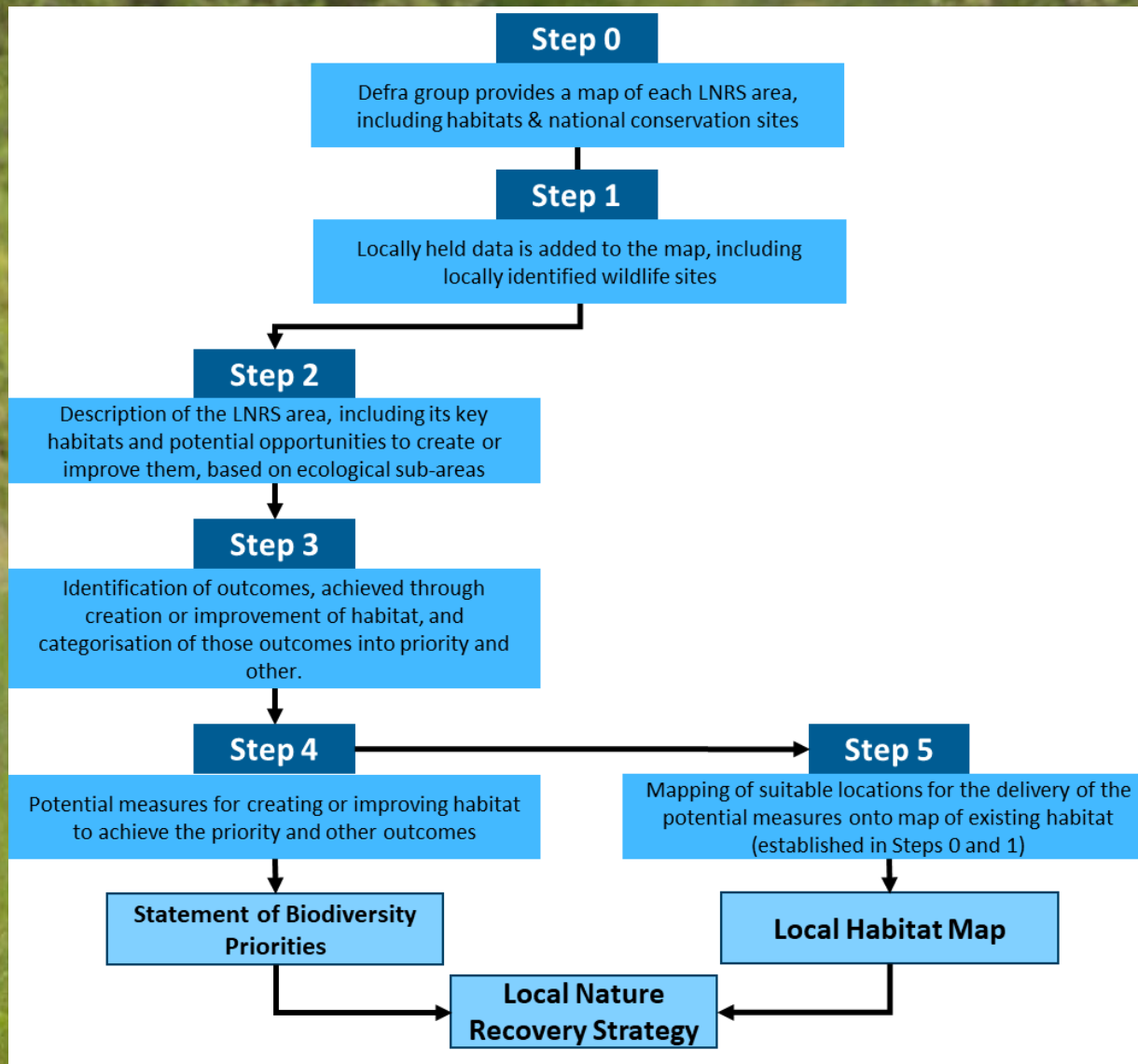
What will a LNRS contain?

- A Local Habitats Map

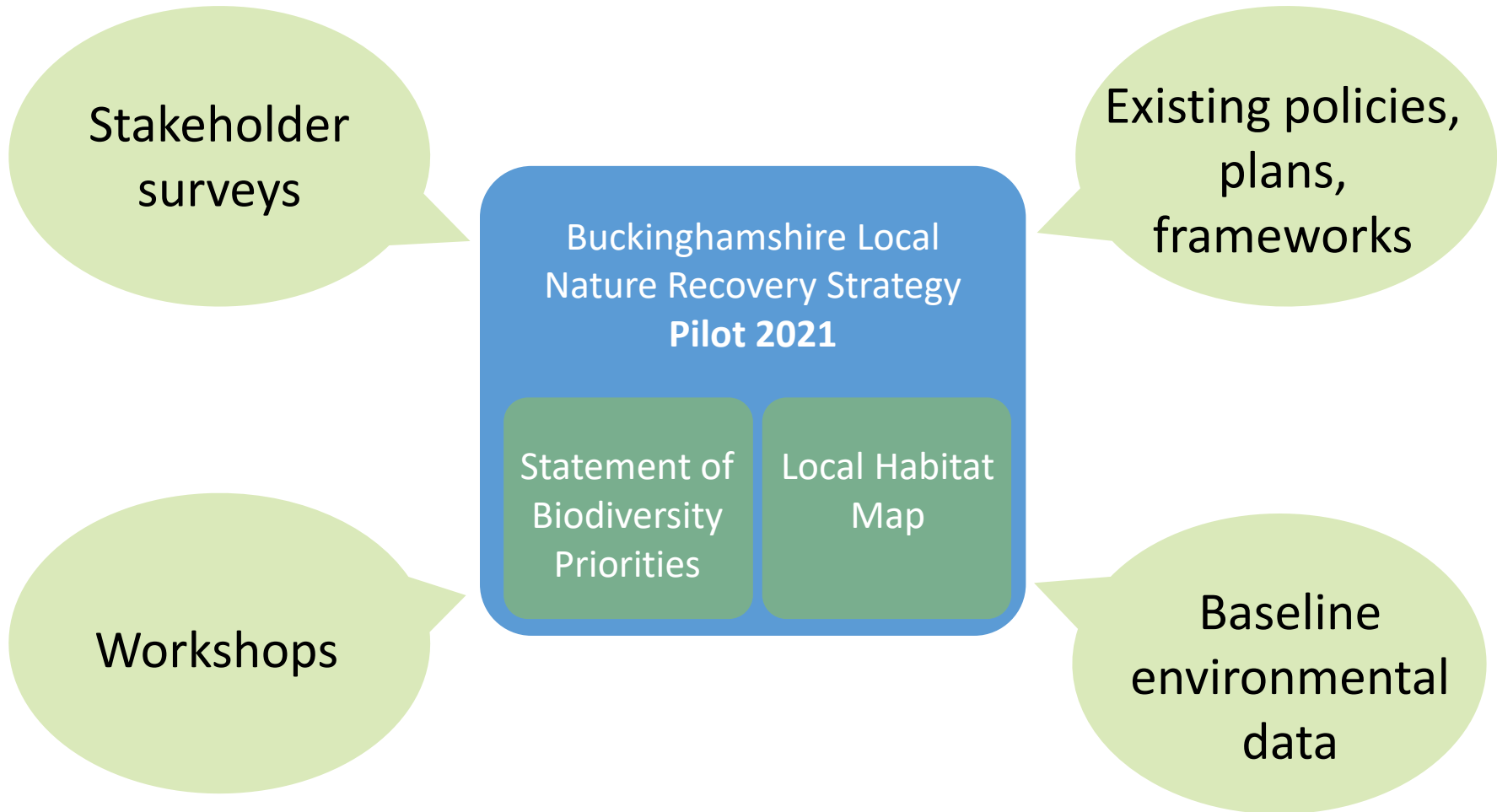

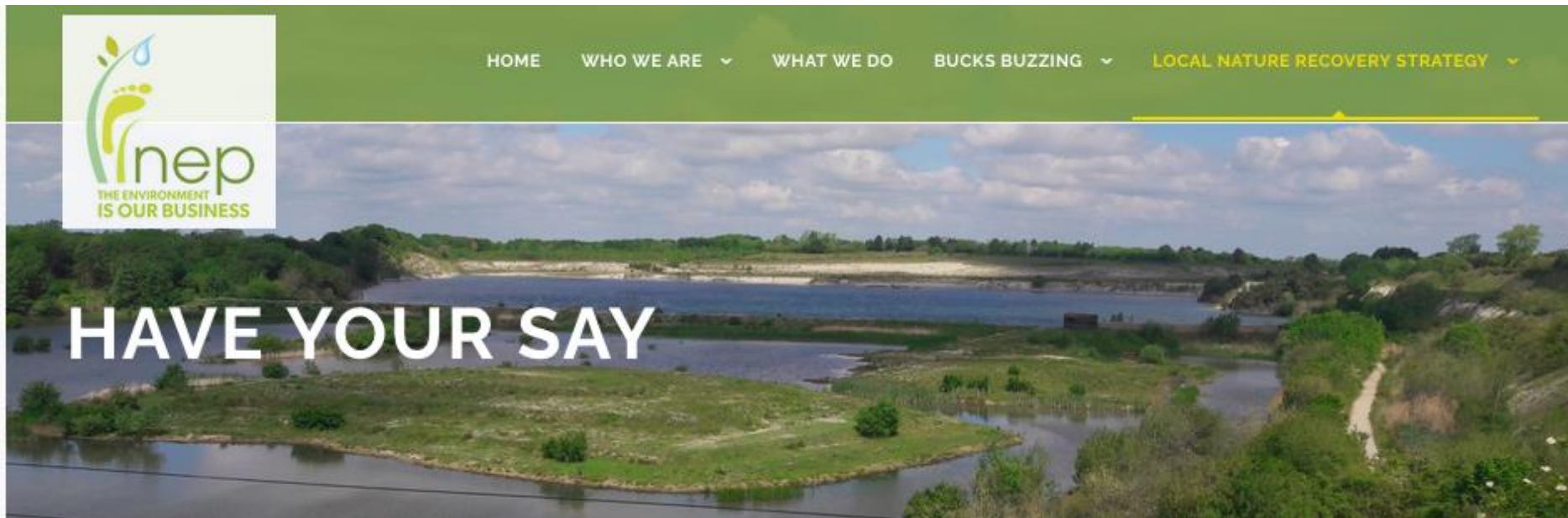

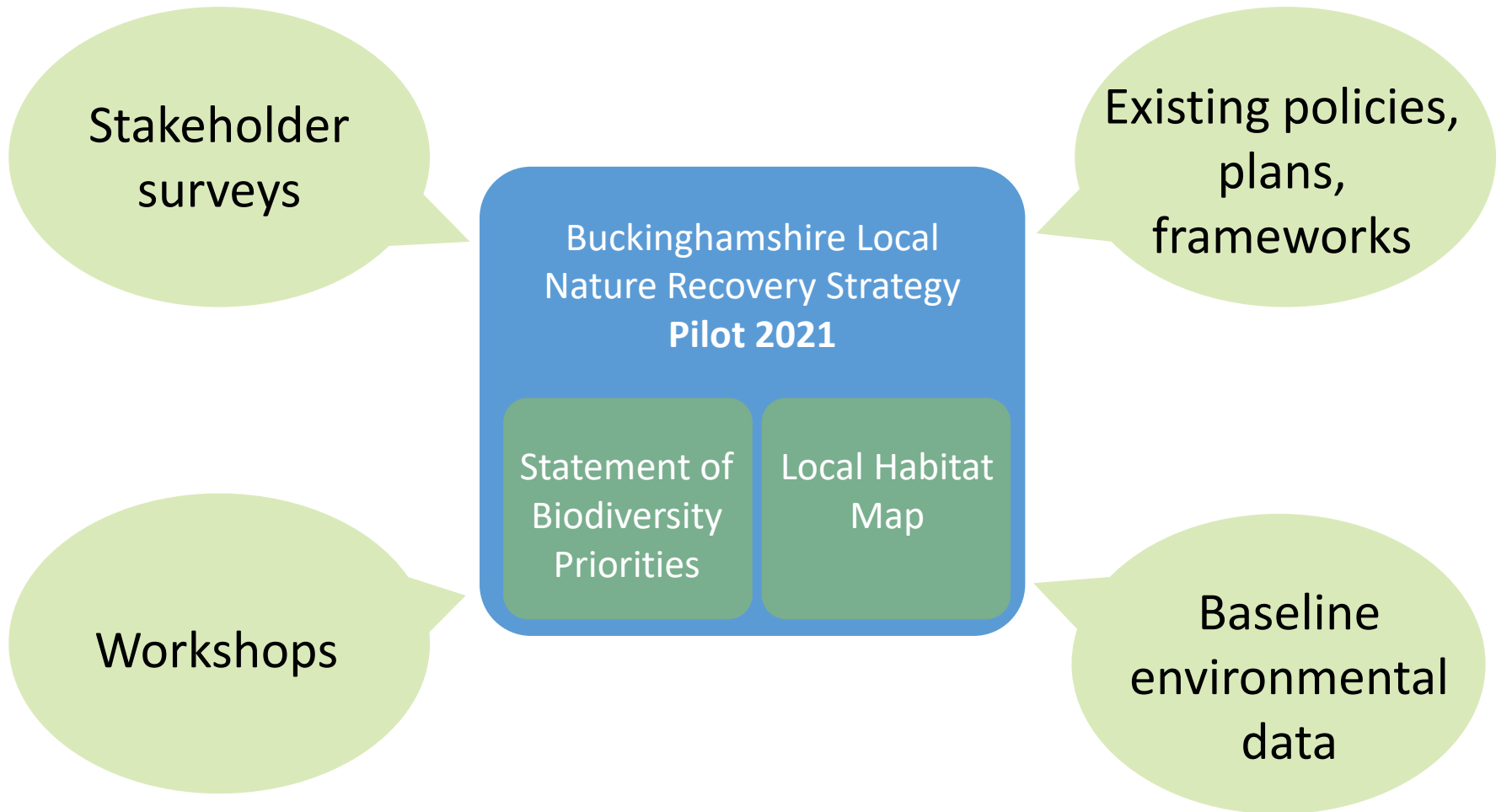
