I'm part of a community group, how can we get Bucks Buzzing?

Create a community garden.

A community garden can be a space for people to come together. Whether its a wildflower garden to benefit local wildlife, a sensory garden for mental wellbeing, or even a vegetable patch, a well-planned community garden space can have many benefits.

Record your wildlife sightings.

Now that your community is buzzing with wildlife, learn to identify and record the animals, insects and birds you're seeing! You can use an app like **iRecord** or submit your sightings to the local **Environmental Records Centre**.

Ask your local parish council to manage its green spaces for wildlife or sign up to the **Plantlife Road Verge campaign**.
